## **Property Description:**

The subject property is located in the Foothills area of the City of Calgary. The warehouse, built in 1981 has a site coverage of 36% and are situated on 1.6 acres of land. The two warehouses have rentable building area of 12,420 and 13,420 sq. ft. respectively and have office spaces of 13% and 12%. Based on the assessment value, this equates to \$159 per sq. ft.

An appeal may be made to the Court of Queen's Bench on a question of law or jurisdiction with respect to a decision of an assessment review board.

Any of the following may appeal the decision of an assessment review board:

- (a) the complainant;
- (b) an assessed person, other than the complainant, who is affected by the decision;
- (c) the municipality, if the decision being appealed relates to property that is within the boundaries of that municipality;
- (d) the assessor for a municipality referred to in clause (c).

An application for leave to appeal must be filed with the Court of Queen's Bench within 30 days after the persons notified of the hearing receive the decision, and notice of the application for leave to appeal must be given to

- (a) the assessment review board, and
- (b) any other persons as the judge directs.
