NEW TOWN OF RAINBOW LAKE ESTABLISHED

Edmonton, Tuesday, August 30, 1966.

The Executive Council has had under consideration the report of the Honourable the Minister of Municipal Affairs, dated August 23rd, 1966, stating that:

Whereas the Rainbow Lake Oil field has been proven to have large reserves of oil, the production of which will require a permanent labour force; and

Whereas representations have been made by the major companies undertaking the development of the said oil fields for provision to accommodate the people engaged in this development; and

Whereas the Provincial Planning Board, after making investigations in the matter, has made certain recommendations with regard thereto; and

Whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient to provide for the establishment of a new town in the said area:

Therefore, upon the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Municipal Affairs, the Executive Council advises that pursuant to the provisions of section 3 of The New Towns Act, being chapter 39 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1956, as amended;

(1) The area of the New Town of Rainbow Lake shall be as follows:

In unsurveyed township 109, range 9, west of the sixth meridian:

All of sections 27, 34 and 35 and the east half of section 33 and the north half and south-west quarter of section 26.

All road allowances and surveyed roads as hereinbefore set out.

(2) The establishment of the New Town of Rainbow Lake shall be effective as, on and from the 1st day of September, 1966.

(3) The following be and are hereby appointed members of the Board of Administrators of the New Town of Rainbow Lake, effective the 1st day of September, 1966:

Norman Stewart Kennedy, Civil Servant,
Department of Municipal Affairs, Edmonton
Donald Forrest Edgar, Civil Servant,
Department of Municipal Affairs, Edmonton

(4) The said Norman Stewart Kennedy be and is hereby appointed Chairman of the said Board.
